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A) Laws governing school service providers:

For obvious reasons, the details of how the students' data are protected are not for public consumption. However, all this information is available in the parent handbook, which is handed out to each parent at the start of each school year. Parents are required to study the document and return a signed page acknowledging that they have read and understood its contents.

The document also includes policies regarding the use of school-supplied laptops and school-supplied internet.

B) List of service providers:

Century link:

Our school uses an Internet service provider. Access to the Internet is controlled by a Firewall with various safety features that protect all users on this side of the firewall.

Gradelink:

All accounts are protected by a secure login. School data is backed up and archived off-site daily. Even if your PC fails or is stolen, all your data remains safe with Gradelink. And you can depend on our system, with 99.99% uptime.

Clever:

Multi-factor authentication and data encryption ensure your data remains private and secure, protected from unauthorized access.

Accelerated reader:

All integrations are aligned to our commitment to automation and data security. Data security. Keep your data secure with our sophisticated security protocols ensuring compliance across federal, state, and local regulations.
